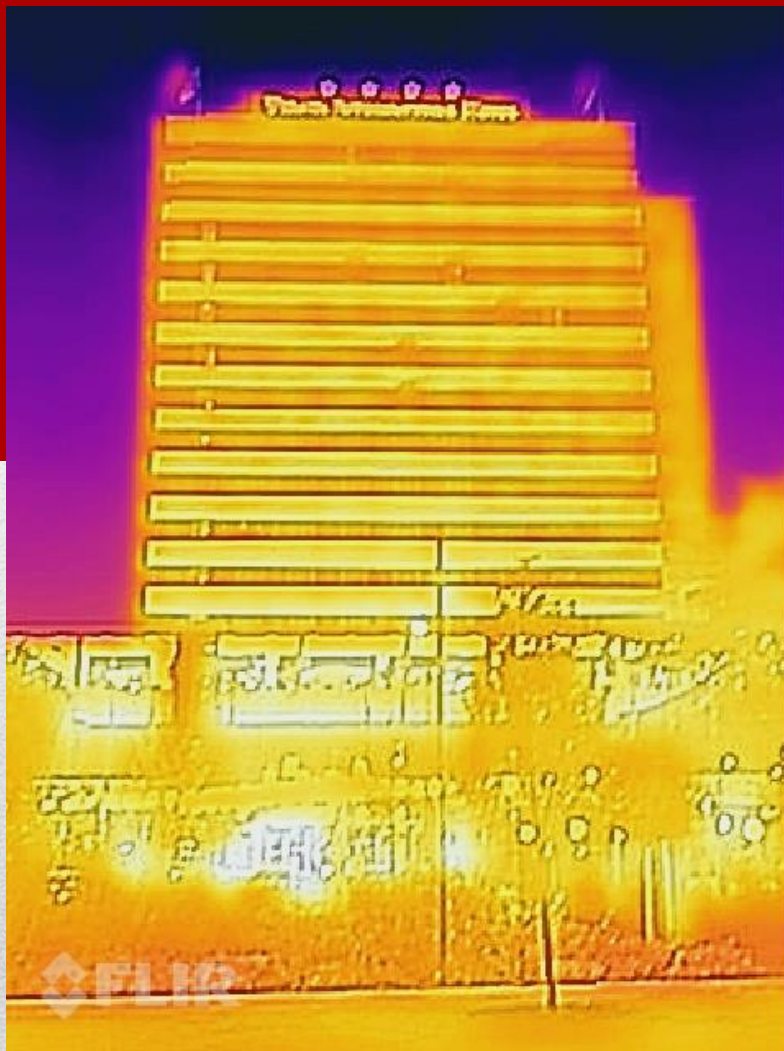


Cooperative audit on Energy Efficiency

Project partners: (Belgium (Flemish region), Bulgaria, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Portugal, and Slovakia)

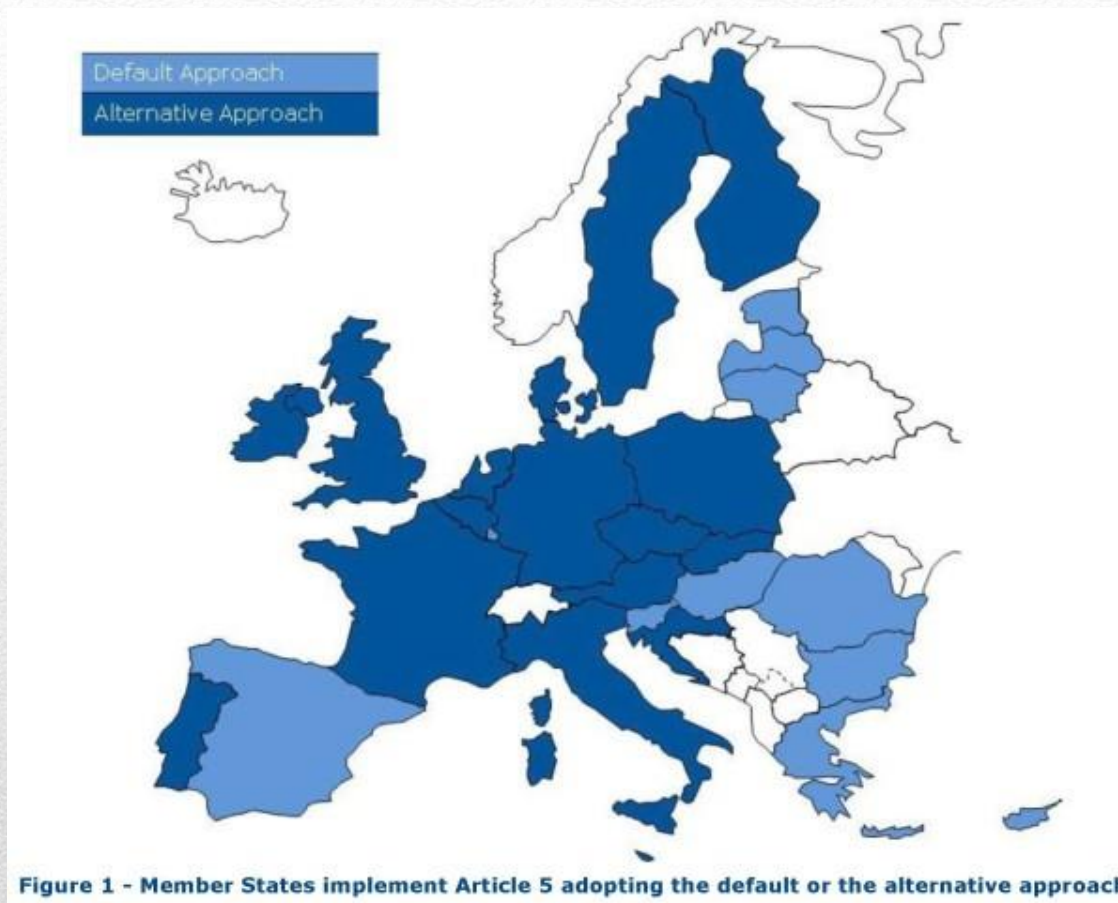
Audit co-leaders – Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania

The main goal of the cooperative audit



To determine :

- 1) how member states have implemented the EU Energy Efficiency and Energy Performance of Buildings directives;
 - 2) how different states are funding energy efficiency renovations;
 - 3) how efficient the monitoring and supervision systems are.

Default approach – 3% building renovation target;

Alternative approach – Member States were allowed to choose other cost effective measures (including deep renovations and measures for behavioral change of occupants), to achieve at least an equivalent amount of savings as through the default approach.
